REPORTING NURSING HOME ABUSE, NEGLECT, AND SUSPICION OF A CRIME: FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS & NY STATE RESOURCES

Reporting Abuse or Neglect

Every resident is entitled to receive the services he or she needs to attain, and maintain, his or her highest practicable physical and psycho-social well-being. This includes being free from abuse and neglect.

The Medicaid Fraud Control Unit accepts and investigates complaints about abuse and neglect. Call 800-771-7755 or file a complaint online at <u>https://ag.ny.gov/comments-mfcu</u>.

<u>The Department of Health</u> (DOH) is responsible for investigating incidents of abuse and neglect, as well as ensuring that residents are protected. To make a complaint, call the Nursing Home Complaint Hotline at **888-201-4563**. Reporting Suspicion of a Crime

Federal law requires that **everyone** who works in a nursing home (including administrative staff and contractors) **must** report any suspicion of a crime against a resident to both DOH *and* law enforcement. Reporting must occur immediately, but not later than two hours after forming the suspicion, if the resident suffers serious bodily injury. Absent serious bodily injury, reporting must occur within 24 hours. Failure to report in the above timeframe to both DOH and law enforcement can result in a fine of \$200,000 or more.

Do not wait for someone else to report suspicion of a crime. If you see something, say something!
