Zoom 101: What is Zoom?

What is Zoom?

- Virtual conferencing that allows you to communicate via video and/or audio.
- Access by computer, laptop, tablet, smartphone, or telephone.
- Attend meetings or webinars.

How can Zoom and other technology resources help LTC residents?

- Facilitate meetings for resident-centered advocacy
- Connect with ombudsmen, families
- Communicate with residents to reduce isolation

Zoom 101: Meetings vs. Webinars

Meetings

- Interactive discussion
- Smaller groups
- Private
- · Communicate by video, audio
- Requires invitation

Webinars

- Lectures, presentations
- Larger audience
- Private or public
- Communicate by chat, Q&A
- Sometimes requires registration


Zoom 101: Downloading Zoom


Downloading Zoom

- If you don't have an account, <u>visit</u>
 <u>zoom.us</u> and select "Sign Up, It's Free" in the top right corner
- On computer, download the Zoom software by visiting https://zoom.us/support/download
- On tablet or smartphone, download the Zoom App via App Store or Google Play.

Zoom 101: Joining a Zoom meeting

- Zoom meeting and webinar invitations arrive via email or text.
- Click "Join" link in the body of the message then download Zoom or launch the app if already downloaded. Then choose "join a meeting."
- You may also join by entering the meeting ID and password manually. (See "Join Meeting" image).
- After joining or starting a meeting, select "Join Audio."





Zoom 101: Joining Zoom Webinars

If registration required...

- Registration link available in email, website, social media.
- Fill out registration form and await email with webinar information.
- Join webinar by selecting link provided in email.

If no registration required...

 Enter Meeting ID and password to join webinar.

Zoom 101: Three Golden Rules


1. Be kind ©

2. Be careful

- Don't say, type, or gesture anything hurtful
- Don't become a Zoom horror story!

3. Remember to mute!

- Turn off camera/microphone if you don't want to be seen or heard (Or if you don't want your dog to be heard)
- Select bottom left microphone
- If dialing in, press "mute" or *6




- Safe and secure place to advocate for residents!

- Familiar faces




Four steps: Set up a Zoom Room Meeting

1. Request a meeting


- Fill out short request form at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/LTCCC-family-council. Also available in LTCCC's Family & Ombudsman Resource Center (https://nursinghome411.org/families-ombudsmen/)
- Name, contact information, facility information, meeting length, number of attendees
- Completed at least one week prior to the meeting
- 2. Await email with meeting info
- 3. Send invitation info to attendees
- Follow up and send reminder emails with instructions.
- 4. Join Meeting!






Zoom 341: Tricks!

- Virtual backgrounds
- Raise your hands and clap your hands with "Reactions"
- Share files in chat
- Chat with individual users or the entire group





Zoom alternatives






