


LTCCC ALERT: NEW DATA ON NURSING HOME RATINGS AND PROBLEM FACILITIES

February 22, 2021 – The Long Term Care Community Coalition (LTCCC) regularly publishes data on key indicators relevant to nursing home care. Today, LTCCC is publishing a Nursing Home Ratings & Info Report featuring facility-level information for all 15,000 U.S. nursing homes, and a Problem Facilities Report featuring user-friendly lists of the approximately 2,400 nursing homes with serious quality issues and/or the lowest overall ratings. Both reports include individual state files which can be downloaded from our new clickable NursingHome411 maps.

The Nursing Home Ratings & Info Report provides data on five-star ratings, ownership type (for-profit vs. non-profit), health inspection outcomes, number of fines, and more. Files can be filtered by category to help users search for facilities within a location and/or category (i.e., Suffolk County for-profit nursing homes). This information can help consumers and advocates assess facility-level performance, regional trends, and more.

The **Problem Facilities Report** provides key information on nursing homes that belong to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services's (CMS) Special Focus Facility (SFF) Program and/or have

been assigned a one-star overall rating. SFFs and SFF Candidates are nursing homes that have a history of serious quality issues or are included in a special program to stimulate improvements in their quality of care. One-star facilities are assigned the lowest overall rating (one out of five stars) based on health inspections, staffing, and quality measures.

→ Note: The federal Five-Star rating system bases its overall rating on staffing levels, health inspection outcomes, and a range of quality measures. While studies have shown that high ratings do not necessarily mean that a nursing home is safe, substandard care in lower-rated facilities has become a matter of increasing public concern.
